

# Changes for 2022

Because of the ongoing impacts of the Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, there are some changes to how GCSE Food Preparation and Nutrition will be assessed in 2022.

These changes are for 2022 only.

## Changes to NEA tasks

- NEA1: Food Investigation Task (15%) – no longer required
- NEA2: Food Preparation Task (50%) – will remain as part of the assessment, but the requirement is now to complete two dishes within 3 hours.

## Breakdown of assessment

Section	Marks available
Section A: Researching the task	6
Recording <b>four to six</b> ideas should allow students to show a good range of skills using different ingredients and processes. When they have recorded their ideas, students will then need to decide which dishes to make.	
Section B: Demonstration of technical skills	18
Make up to <b>three</b> technical dishes	
Section C: Planning for the final menu	8
Plan to make <b>two</b> final dishes	
Section D: Making the final dishes	30
Make <b>two</b> final dishes. During the practical assessment, the teacher will be assessing:	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• use and execution of a range of technical skills</li></ul>	

Section	Marks available
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>it is acknowledged that the making of only two dishes (as opposed to three) provides less opportunity for the coverage of food preparation skills.</li> </ul>	

Section E: Analyse and evaluate

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- Analysis and evaluation of **two** final dishes
- Sensory evaluation could be done in a home setting. This can be achieved by setting up testing panels and a variety of sensory analysis methods can be used. It is not advised to carry out testing within a classroom environment because of hygiene and safety issues related to coronavirus.

## No changes to the exam

The exam will still cover the same subject content written in the specification.
